October 10th, 2017 School Council Meeting Minutes

1 Welcome

All present: School Council members, Principal Dennis Pare, Teacher representatives and committee representatives.

2 Principal Update by Dennis Pare:

Successful PD Day: The day focussed on learning plans, numeracy and data on school's EQAO scores; they are good however there is room for improvement. Currently looking to students that are not meeting the grade expectations and investigation why. Also looked at data on student perceptions of school life. That lead to a discussion on bullying.

Staff Update: Staffing process is unfolding as quickly as possible. School was able to add an additional 7/8 class which meant that the class size went from 34/35 to 20 students per class.

Yard: The soccer field is almost open!

Parking Lot: Is for staff use, however there will be a sign indicating hours when families are welcome to park there. Some of the lights in the new parking lot are not working - Dennis will look into it.

Student Exchange Idea: Previously done with Korea and would like to explore a similar opportunity with a different country. With a focus on grades 6-8.

3 Chair Update by Carrie Cuhaci

Ski Club Volunteer Need- They have a director to run the program but they need a volunteer to organize the volunteers for this clubs. Ski club runs from grade 5-8. Lessons are mandatory for all students for 1 hour, have dinner and then free ski. Takes place on Fridays during the winter. Leaves the school at 4pm and are back before 10pm. Registration and insurance is done through Dovercourt. Position will commence in November.

Public Nurse - School council is passing on the idea of a parent lice workshop.

Setting the Budget: Everyone agrees that the we will listen to committee proposals today and they will only have to present to School Council to vote on significant changes to their plans.
