# **Broadview Parent Council December 11, 2018 – Meeting Minutes**

#### 1. Welcome, approval of agenda, approval of last month's minutes

#### 2. School Update

Principal/Vice-Principal

- Frequency of psychology services for Broadview has been increased to once per week from former bi-weekly approach to assist with a range of psychological services for students (e.g. psychoeducational assessments for students with complex learning profiles, mental health support).
- Working on securing decision/plans for classroom allocations for next year in the event of increased enrollment - currently at 1090 students, with no vacant classrooms and no more space for portables.
- Teachers are scoping/costing a new collaborative art project for future proposal to Council, with emphasis on kindness, inclusiveness and community: "Broadview's Got H'Art" (each student to paint a canvas).
- Chromebooks supplied by Council have arrived and are in circulation. New technology provided by Council will henceforth be labeled as such to facilitate tracking and to recognize Council contribution
- Leveled readers purchased by the school have been received in part. Remainder are on back-order, with no ETA at this time.
- Math New funding to facilitate teacher participation in collaborative inquiry/assessment of math instructional strategies. Piloting "MathUp" software in grades five and six.

# Teacher

- WITS Initiative (Walk away, Ignore, Talk it out, Seek help) and promotion underway and proving successful. Assemblies held with students, including with older students to recruit four student WITS ambassadors – identifiable at recess by yellow pinnies - to support/empower younger students to use WITS at recess.
- Clubs and activities well underway (e.g. gr 3 & 4 recorder club, junior robotics, intermediate puppetry troupe at York Street Public School the week of December 17, grade two art rotation, Kinders had a visit from Little Ray's).
- Upcoming holiday concerts:
  - o Grade 8 concert and jazz band December 13
  - Primary sing-along week of December 17
  - o Grade 1 concert December 18
  - Kindergarten concert and open house December 18
- December 18 several teachers participating in Ozobot coding workshop, with a view to student participation in the new year (possible teacher-run student workshops or Ozobot club)

## 3. Ottawa Carleton Assembly of School Council (OCASC) Update

- Two consultations underway
  - Building Brighter Futures at the OCDSB seeking input by December 12 for OCDSB's four year strategic plan. Students in grades seven through twelve also invited to participate in consultation.
  - o Provincial consultation seeking input by December 15 via survey or open submission format.
  - OCASC representative for Broadview School Council (Donna) is also our representative on the OCDSB's Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) and can help answer questions on special education matters.

#### 4. Chair Update

- School Council update emails to be sent weekly through administration staff. Council members who wish to have information included in these emails should contact Co-Chair, Michelle Milne.
- New "ask the Principal" feature to be implement at at Council meetings. Email Michelle Milne between meetings if you would like to hear from the Principal on a particular topic.
- Broadview School Council Constitution is outdated and in need of updating (e.g. include a mechanism for online voting, define quorum in an online context). Explore existing model constitutions to build from.
- Proposed new process for votes in between meetings (e.g. Survey Monkey) –
   Committees/members anticipating the need for a vote between meetings will announce at a
   Council meeting their intent to do so and collect the contact information of those present to serve
   as the distribution list/intended audience for said survey/vote.

## 5. Treasurer Update

### 6. Yard Renewal Update and Discussion

- Board contact has moved on. Efforts underway to bring new contact up to speed and obtain
  information re. options and costs. This, combined with teacher input regarding their vision/needs
  for outdoor project(s), will inform a presentation to Council and staff, with a view to setting out a
  structured three-year plan. \* Teacher rep(s) from Council to seek input on staff vision and report
  back.
- Decisions will be required around how much will be funded by Council versus seeking other means of funding (e.g. business sponsorship).
- Targeting a finalized three-year plan by end of 2018-19 school year, with submission to the Board in early September.

#### 7. Budget and Calendar for 2018-19, including vote

- Total 2018-19 budget: \$98,000 (VOTED ON AND APPROVED)
  - \$66,000 fundraised last year
  - October meeting approved spend of \$36,200 for specific items
  - o \$35,000 set aside for major yard project this year
  - \$26,800 to be divided among Divisions (voted on favourably at this meeting).

  - Science: Science module kits (replaces Science in the Schools); Robots; University of Ottawa Maker Lab (coding); Reptiles Rock (discussion around looking at ways to expand science activities next year – e.g. UofO Maker Lab could inpire/influence future programs)

  - Oct 2019: Vote on final budget based on proposals received from committees
  - o Nov 2019: Post final calendar of council activities for teachers
