5. Treasurer Update

6. Yard Renewal Update and Discussion – Vicky, Holly and Michelle

Once we have approval within council and the funds, the board runs with project. Representatives met with school board who gave strict parameters on what we can and cannot do. Goal to inspire kids, support nature and add safe structures. Recommend a 4 phased approach.

a) **Shade Structure Phase 1**: Structure to last all year long – up to 30 kids for outdoor activities – shade/shelter. Big open space. Proposed large space just inside of parking lot. Under structure a series of picnic tables. To be built July/August 2019. Approve drawings by January 2019. Need 90% of funds ready. Get tenders and have balance of money by March.

We already have \$35000 collected over the years, estimated to be about \$50-60k. Should we do a separate fundraiser, should we set a goal of \$70k? What is realistic to expect from council.

b) **Phase 2, 3, 4 Nature and Play** (5 year plan much smaller projects) Nature inspired play structure for children. Stump seats, logs, play hut, butterfly garden, native trees, fruit trees, musical feature?

Budget available this year is \$35,000. We will likely require a special event fundraiser to support a large purchase this year. Big challenge is that the proposed location for a structure will remove the primary outdoor space.

Council recommended getting more details on location options with different structure materials. Request drawings for both large outdoor space as well as smaller structures in the larger space. December council meeting bring back something to vote on for final approach decision for 2018/19.

7. Budget and Calendar for 2018/2019, including vote

Ted Zeisner - swag online store to sell Broadview hats, etc. Has been done manually in the past and we are looking to replace with local distributor who can house online store through Accent Logos using PayPal.

100% of proceeds go back to council. If anyone disagrees, email council. Otherwise in December we will have finalized version available for consideration.

**Suggestion for council to donate some of the swag to classrooms? Give away at Dance-a-thon, etc.

Goal is to maximize community talent. General consensus we have to get better at saying what we need and collaborating to deliver results for the students.
