2. Administration welcome and update (Lead: Principal)

- 41 homerooms this year
 - Vacancies to be filled, long term occasional provisions
- Enrollment 832 students within footprint this year almost
- English program grade 1-8 and French Immersion 1-8, learning disability grades 1-8 from across the city, behaviour intervention program (social skills) max of 8 students, no gifted program here at Broadview
- Slowly returning to normal, intermediates can leave at the nutrition breaks, conversations about behaviour in large groups in the neighbourhood
- Staff meeting teachers signing up for clubs, committees, intermurals
- Progress is slow as teachers are still cautious as is to be expected
- Terry Fox run next Friday, Sept 30 Truth and Recognition, cross country will be running, games club to start
- COVID protocols some kids wearing masks, less than there have been in past years
- Primaries go out first then junior eat so not all in the yard at the same time
- Fire drills, sounding of the alarm to help familiarize the students
- First fire drill on Thursday slow motion fire drill, the second one will be randomly done
- Secure school drills to come, lockdown during COVID the drill was in classrooms now will be for the school
- School climate survey results distributed, see attached
 - 500 students completed the survey, children filled out survey via chromebooks, no internet access during the time the survey was completed
- Parent question: More grades mixed these year why?
 - o Comes down to numbers

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- o In English there is a triple, in every grade in the immersion grades
- o All about grouping of students is how they are put in those class, try not to have mixed grade
- o Ratio English to French Immersion 6 to 1
- o Smaller ratio in the intermediate grades due to being feeder school
- Intramurals and extracurriculars to be announced, communications to be sent
- Maya to put Facebook posts to inform parents
- Meet the teacher two sessions to help the crowds in the classes
- Meet teachers from 4:30-5:30, kids to be supervised by parents
- 41 classes, either workshop or buses are being asked more info to come
